Dear Parents,

On Tuesday evening, we held our Easter discos. Organised by the Friends, these also help to provide valuable funds in order to support our children. I am grateful to the Friends of the School who provided each of our children with an Easter egg to take home.

We continue to enjoy close links with Yorkshire Wolds Teacher Training and this week we were pleased to welcome Miss Morton-Edwards to the school. Miss Morton-Edwards will be working alongside Miss McDonald to support the children in Class 1 until June.

This week has been National Sign Language week and as part of this, we were pleased to once again welcome a group of children and staff from the Resource Base at Christopher Pickering Primary School to our school. As part of their visit, the children and staff visited each of our classes to take part in an online British Sign Language lesson alongside our children. By the end of the session, many of our children could spell their name in sign language and recognise some basic signs such as hello and thank you. Links such as these are an important way to enrich our curriculum and it was wonderful to once again see our visitors, some of whom have been visiting since they were in Reception!

As we enter the summer term, our thoughts turn to our programme of residential visits. I am pleased that alongside our Class 4 visit to Kingswood, we can now confirm the dates for our Class 3 residential visit to Spiers Bank House. This will take place between the 17th and 19th June for the children in Year 3 and the 19th and 21st June for the children in Year 4. Further details about the visit will follow as soon as we return after Easter.

Tomorrow is a school training day and therefore school will be closed to pupils. We will, however, be taking a group of children to watch a professional netball match at Hull University on Friday evening. Including the many sports events that our children take part in, this will be the 24th time that groups of children have been taken off site this academic year. I am immensely grateful to our staff for working so hard and giving up their time to provide these opportunities for our children.
